A regular on RTE Radio, the talents of Emilie's in-demand support musicians: Johnny Taylor (piano), Dave Fleming (double bass) and Dominic Mullan (drums), among Ireland's leading musicians, are sought after north and south.

Emilie Conway "is a heart stealer with the voice of an angel, smooth, mellow, sincere and deeply connected to both music and lyrics," said musical observer Fionna Duncan.
